A few months ago we wrote to invite a representative of your Club to join the Companion Events Group eList. We currently have 375 individuals on the List with new members being added every day.

In this short time this list has had over 1,600 posts with discussion on items such as: (1) ways to increase entries (use of practice rings; discounting the fee for a second entry; refunding some, or all, of the entry fee for bitches in season, offering optioning titling classes, not scrimping on trophies/prizes, etc.); (2) ways to save money on Trials (sharing expenses for associated specialties, better utilization of a Judge's time, use of volunteer stewards, etc.; (3) arranging for local publicity for Trials; (4) publicizing the need for several Parent Clubs' need for Agility equipment and/or Trial Secretary for National Specialties, etc.; (4) facilitating the dissemination and subsequent discussion of changes in AKC Regulations or procedures; and, more recently, (5) examples of ways Clubs are using to attract and retain younger members.

We are happy to see a 9.5% overall growth in entries for Companion Events for the year 2012 over 2011. But we cannot become complacent with this statistic. It is our hope that by the exchange of information relative to all Companion events this figure will grow, that our events will not needlessly suffer financially, and that our dogs and exhibitors will continue to have fun and personal reward by training, exhibiting, and participating in Club events. To all AKC Clubs Licensed for Obedience/Rally/Tracking:

I would like to take the opportunity to highlight a couple of changes approved by the AKC Board of Directors that may benefit your club.

AKC RALLY® REGULATION CHANGES:

Effective June 1, 2013 — Rally Trials are now a separate event.

Clubs may now hold Rally Trials without regard to the number of Obedience Trials they are also holding. Rally is now considered a separate AKC event and is not tied to any other AKC event. If a club is licensed for Obedience they may now hold up to 12 Rally Trials per year. Any clubs not currently licensed for Obedience but who would like to offer Rally events will be required to successfully hold a minimum of one Sanctioned Rally A Match. For more information please contact the Companion Events Department at Rally@akc.org. The Regulations for Rally have been changed as shown below.

Chapter 1, Section 1. Application to Hold a Rally Trial. Clubs meeting the AKC requirements that wish to hold a rally trial must apply on the form provided by the AKC and submit the appropriate application fee. A rally trial is a separate event with a separate event number. The event application and fee must be submitted at least 18 weeks before the closing date for entries to the event. The trial may be held as a separate event or in



conjunction with another event. Clubs may hold no more than 12 Rally trials per calendar vear.

Effective Immediately — AKC Rally® National Championship.

The AKC Board approved an AKC Rally® National Championship, and amended the Rally Regulations to provide for it. The first event will be held in the spring of 2014 in conjunction with the Companion Events Extravaganza.

EVENT APPLICATION FEES:

Effective January 1, 2014 — New Event Application Fees.

The AKC Rally®, Obedience, Tracking and Agility event application fees have been changed effective for events held on or after **January 1, 2014** as follows:

AKC Rally trials with over 30 entries (based on the previous year's corresponding trial) will have a \$50.00 event application fee (a reduction from the current \$100.00 application fee). Regardless of the number of entries based on the previous year's corresponding trial, a minimum event application fee of \$25.00 will be charged for:

minimum event approauenties of \$20.00 min be charged for.

Test Information

- BAER TESTING: Canines must be at least 35 days old. The BAER test (Brainstorm Auditory Evoked Response) detects electricalactivity in the cochle & auditory pathways in the brain. Bilateral hearing passes the test. Unilateral or bilateral
- HEART SCREENING: Cardiac Auscultation is done with the animal standing & restrained. The dog should first be given time to rest & acclimate to the environment. The vet should be able to identify the cardiac valve areas for auscultation. He will gradually move the stethoscope across all valve areas & also should auscultate over the subaortic area, ascending aorta, pulmonary artery & the left craniodorsal cardiac base. Following examination of the left precordium, the right precordium should be
- PATELLAS: Exam of knees for patellar luxation.
- MICROCHIP INSERTION: AKC Chips
- EYE CERF: Canine Eye Registration Foundation; Dog's eyes will need to be dilated.

Greetings! The purpose of this email is to see if you are interested in coordinating your breed for our Meet the Breed again.

Attached are copies of our Guidelines and general information on MTB.

The purpose of Meet the Breed is to present good quality specimens to the public, to educate their eye, help a family avoid making the "wrong" breed purchase, and to introduce the public to a few of the responsible members of the fancy to offset some of the negative press out there. Once again, we have made no changes to our guidelines.

First the "No" list:

No sale of puppies in the MTB ring.

No preliminary discussion/negotiations of stud dog service.

No discussion of dogs available for rescue placements in the MTB ring.

Bitches in season are not allowed in the MTB ring.

No personal business cards or personal contact information may be given out.

Now the "Yes" list:

All sorts of breed information is encouraged.

Club information, including meeting dates, location and times, breeder referral, membership list, rescue contacts, training contacts, etc. is encouraged.

We also encourage parent club contact information including rescue contacts and breeder referral contacts.

Young dogs may be changed out or removed if they become tired.

A copy of our guidelines is attached in case you need to review them or in case you want to hand them out to your presenters.

We will be back in touch with you AFTER THE JUDGING SCHEDULE COMES

OUT with your scheduled time.

As always, the person who contacts us will be considered our primary contact for your breed.

This will be the person we contact for scheduling. This will also be the person was contact if we see a problem in the ring.



If your club wants to participate but the primary contact MAY CHANGE, that's fine. Just let us know and we can work with you.

AKC no longer requires a letter or spreadsheet from us; however, if you want one, we will be glad to provide one.

For that reason, we really need the <u>correct</u> name of the club to help AKC make accurate notes and postings.

If there is a particular email address where the letter should be sent, we will, of course, need to know that, too.

MEET THE BREED" A Public Education Presentation of the RELIANT PARK WORLD SERIES OF DOG SHOWS

PURPOSE

To provide an organized function where the public may come, see, and be around dogs from breeds in which they are interested and talk to breeders / exhibitors / and/or specialty club representatives. We believe a well-educated public will make better selections in the puppies they choose. We hope our program will help to lower the number of puppies found in shelters and rescue organizations. We also encourage interest in all aspects of the sport of purebred dogs.

ADVANTAGES TO THOSE PARTICIPATING

- Easy forum to promote good public relations for clubs and breed supporters.
- No cost to the clubs/groups participating except for handouts.
- Information may be disseminated on puppy selection, general breed information; and club meetings, activities, rescue programs, etc., resulting in a better educated public and attracting new participants in all aspects of the sport of pure-bred dogs.

COMMITTEE RESPONSIBILITIES

- Organize the activity and schedule breed times.
- Ensure participants adhere to participant guidelines and provide schedule and crowd control, when needed.
- Provide general dog-care handouts and answer very general questions; answer breed-specific questions by forwarding the person asking the question to the Specialty Club Booth (if the club has one at the show); direct other questions to the AKC booth, the veterinary association booth, or dog food booths, as appropriate.

HISTORY

Our Meet the Breed program has proven to be successful from its beginning with over 100 breeds of dogs being presented each year. Several of our success stories involve spectators who found a breed in which they were interested, purchased a puppy, joined a breed club and learned, and got involved in the sport in various venues, including some who owner-handled dogs to championships, and now take their turn presenting dogs in the Meet the Breed ring.

PARTICIPATION GUIDELINES

Committee Responsibilities, the Ring, and Breed Scheduling

Generally, breeds are changed every hour and are in the ring for approximately 40 minutes at a time. Breeds should plan to begin exiting the ring at about 10 minutes before the hour and should gather at the ring about 5 minutes before the hour to be ready to enter the ring as soon as the ring is vacated. It usually takes approximately 10 minutes for individual breeds to set up for their presentation.

The ring is "divided" into separate areas for the breeds being presented. Grooming tables are provided to allow the smaller breeds and those dogs which generally draw large crowds, to be presented off the floor. Groupings of chairs will be provided for the large breeds that are presented on the floor. Two large dog breeds and two to three small dog breeds are generally scheduled in the ring at the same time. If there are color, coat, or size varieties of a breed, all of them are presented at the same time.

Breeds are generally scheduled no earlier than 45 minutes following the <u>end</u> of their scheduled judging time. This helps to eliminate double grooming, allows for dogs to be given water and a chance to exercise, and does not interfere with handlers' normal ring preparation – whether it be grooming, exercise, or mental/bonding preparation with the dog.

The Meet the Breed committee will schedule the breeds, manage the ring usage, and handle crowd control to ensure a space "crunch" does not occur in the ring – either from too many people or from too many breeds during a time change.

An information table is provided. Handouts are encouraged and may either be given out at the breed area while the breed is in the ring or placed on the information table. AKC brochures on such topics as enjoying a dog show, purchasing a puppy, locating a breeder, etc. will be provided. We refer people with specific questions to the AKC booth, a breed club booth if one is available, to the booth for the veterinary organization covering the show, or to dog food vendors, as appropriate.

Participants and Dogs Being Presented

The dogs representing a breed should be good specimens as compared to the breed standard, clean, and of good temperament.

Those individuals presenting dogs in the Meet the Breed ring should be neatly dressed. Remember that first impressions are lasting. The breeders in the Meet the Breed ring will be the first breeders many members of the general public have ever met. If they leave with the impression that breeders are intelligent, clean, neat people who are concerned with producing healthy, well-adjusted puppies, they will look for such a breeder when they are ready to buy. A good impression made now will also help offset unfavorable media press or publicity later. A suit is not necessary. Ring attire or a skirt or slacks and a nice shirt or blouse or sweater are all very appropriate.

The sale of puppies, stud service, or rescue placements is not appropriate in the Meet the Breed and will not be allowed. This includes discussions of puppies or rescue placements not present in the ring. If someone wishes to purchase a puppy or to discuss a rescue placement, information on the club's breeder referral contact or rescue chair should be given out. If there is no local breed club, an individual may give out his address and phone number for breed information but should still avoid discussing puppies for sale while in the ring. Anyone observed giving out a personal business card or personal contact information will first be warned and then asked to

leave the ring if the warning is ignored. Additionally, that individual will not be invited to participate again next year.

Remember: the purpose of the Meet the Breed ring is to sell the <u>BREED</u> – NOT to sell puppies

To keep our committee out of club or breed politics, the person who first commits a breed to participate in Meet
the Breed (or the breed representative designated by that person) becomes the primary contact responsible
for gathering the people and dogs together who will represent the breed.

Breed Presentation Guidelines

As a minimum, a breed should be represented by one adult male, one adult female, and one young dog. If a breed has differences in coat color or coat type, it is very nice to have dogs representing some of the different coat colors or coat types. (The adult male can be one color, the adult female a different color, and the young dog still another color.) This will generally give a good representation of the quantity or type of coat, sizes of dogs, and temperament differences that may be present in a breed.

Many breeds have substantial coat care changes as a dog matures or substantial temperament differences according to the age of the dog. This should be kept in mind when representatives are selected. One breed was represented by a puppy, a 2-year old dog, and a 4-year old dog to show temperament changes within the breed. Although the 4-year old dog was very easy going and sedate, the puppy was quite outgoing and the 2-year old dog, while calmer than the puppy, was still a handful. The breed contact felt that the public should see the three temperament stages.

We can work with any group trying to spotlight a breed-specific problem. For example, Dalmatians are regularly presented and many spectators mention being surprised that the dogs are as active and as interested in everything going on around them as they are. A different impression has been created by the very popular Disney movies.

Breed presentations are not restricted (except where the presentation might impact another breed being presented close by.) Some breeds have presented several excellent representatives and one poor representative of a breed so that people could see the different quality of the dogs side by side, with an explanation being given of the faults in the poor specimen. The breeds that have done this have been very satisfied with the response from the public; however, all dogs being presented should be clean and of good temperament.

BITCHES IN SEASON SHOULD NOT BE BROUGHT INTO THE MEET THE BREED RING.

Club Guidelines

Just as we do not restrict breed presentations, we do not restrict breed clubs. Some presenters have chosen to wear appropriate costumes such as kilts for a presentation of Westies. Some clubs have chosen to use their presentation time as an official public education presentation for their club and have put their club's banner behind their breed presentation station or have presented the dogs on a table on which they have placed their club table cover. Such banners or table covers are welcome but must be removed when the breed's presentation time ends.



Meet the Breed has proven to be a very successful and popular program with owners, handlers, the public, and the dogs themselves! MEET THE BREED - PRESENTER GUIDELINES

Meet the Breed serves several very important purposes:

- 1.) It provides an organized function where the public may come, see, and be around good quality dogs from breeds in which they are interested and where they can talk to breeders / exhibitors / and/or specialty club representatives.
- 2.) By educating the public, we help the public avoid purchasing the wrong breed and, thereby, help to reduce the number of dogs who are released to shelters or rescue programs.
- 3.) It helps to create a positive impression of breeders and dog show people as people who are knowledgeable about, and caring of, their dogs and helps to offset negative impressions of breeders created by negative media publicity.
- 4.) Through positive impressions given at Meet the Breed, people can be encouraged to acquire a dog, contact a club, find a mentor, and become involved in the sport.

PARTICIPATION RULES AND GUIDELINES

The dogs representing a breed should be good specimens as compared to the breed standard, clean, and of good temperament.

Presenters should be neatly dressed. A suit is <u>not</u> necessary. Ring attire or a skirt or slacks and a nice shirt or blouse or sweater are all very appropriate. The breeders in the Meet the Breed ring will be the first breeders many spectators have ever met. Remember that **first impressions are lasting**.

Bitches in season should not be brought into Meet the Breed.

Breeds are changed every hour. Presenters should gather at the ring about 5 minutes before the hour to be ready to enter the ring as soon as the ring is vacated and plan to begin exiting the ring shortly before the hour ends..

Handouts on puppy selection, general breed information; and club meetings, activities, rescue programs, etc. are encouraged and may be given out. Handouts may be placed on the information table when the breed exits the ring, if desired.

SALE OF PUPPIES OR STUD SERVICE

THE SALE OF PUPPIES, STUD SERVICE, OR RESCUE PLACEMENTS IS NOT APPROPRIATE IN THE MEET THE BREED RING AND WILL NOT BE ALLOWED. This includes discussions and preliminary sales negotiations of puppies/rescues not present in the ring. If someone wishes to purchase a puppy, contract for stud service, or acquire a dog from the breed rescue, contact information for the club's breeder referral contact or rescue contact should be given out. If there is no local breed club, an individual may give out his address and phone number for breed information but should still avoid discussing sales of puppies, stud service, or rescue placements while in the ring.

Anyone observed not following these guidelines will first be warned and then asked to leave the ring if the warning is ignored. Additionally, that breed may not be invited to participate again next year.

REMEMBER, SELL THE BREED – NOT PUPPIES!
